

Young Republicans on Climate

in the 2022 Election

In a nationwide survey of 1,000 actual voters taken on Election Night and the day after, young Republicans decisively expressed their concern for climate change and their desire for climate solutions.

Young Republicans are the pro-nuclear generation. Everyone is pro-renewables.

Republicans aged 18-29 ranked nuclear energy as having the second most positive impact in a list of climate solutions. Republicans over 50 uears old ranked natural climate solutions second. Both ranked renewables as number one.



In the same question, Republicans aged 18-29 ranked "eliminating fossil fuels" dead last in a list of climate solutions. Among 18-29 year-olds generally, this message did not do much better.
